

Thanks to a generous donation from SC Johnson, the STEM Scholars Pathway program for female students, students of color and low income students allows you to pursue your interests in science, technology, engineering and math while receiving funding to earn your bachelor's degree and enter a cutting-edge career.

You'll complete the first two years of your program at Gateway Technical College, earning an associate degree before transferring to Carthage College, Concordia University Wisconsin, or Milwaukee School of Engineering to complete the last two years and earn your bachelor's degree.

### Why apply for the SC Johnson STEM Scholars Pathway?

- Get a cutting-edge STEM education. Gain hands-on experience in the classroom with the latest industry technology as you learn from top faculty at some of the area's leading STEM colleges and universities.
- Prepare for an in-demand STEM career. STEM Scholars Pathway program areas prepare you to graduate with the high-tech skills that area employers are looking for.
- Receive dedicated support to help you succeed. As a STEM Scholar, you'll receive student support and mentoring services to help you navigate your college experience and succeed in your coursework.

- STEM Scholars is open to:
  - Female students
  - Underrepresented students of color
  - Low income students
- Applicants must be graduating seniors attending a high school in Racine County and residing within the Racine Unified School District
- ◆ Applicants must have a cumulative high school GPA of 2.0 or higher at the time of application
- Applicants must be pursuing a STEM-related college degree in: Electrical Engineering, Architectural-Structural Engineering, IT-Data Analytics, IT-Cybersecurity, IT-Network Specialist, IT-Web Software Developer or IT-Software Developer

#### **Program Support**

- ◆ Financial Support: STEM Scholars will receive \$7,500 per year for your first two years at Gateway Technical College. Then, students who meet the transfer requirements and enroll at Carthage College, Concordia University Wisconsin, or MSOE will receive \$7,500 per year for your final two years plus a matching \$7,500 per year scholarship from the 4-year college.
- ◆ Student Support: As a STEM Scholar, you'll join a cohort of STEM Scholars receiving dedicated student support and mentoring services from Gateway's STEM Scholars Coordinator and others to help you navigate your college experience and succeed in your coursework.
